"We couldn't be here without the support of our local community," said Lisa Robitshek, manager of Meals on Wheels. "Federal and State dollars support only one-third of Meals on Wheels funding. This year, we are reaching out to individuals and businesses in the community to raise \$100,000 so that we can continue to serve those who need Meals on Wheels the most.

Malnutrition and poor nutrition occur frequently in the growing elderly population. Lack of proper nutrition over long periods of time can cause multiple health issues. Meals on Wheels delivers daily nutritionally balanced meals to frail, homebound seniors over 60 years of age who are unable to shop, prepare meals for themselves and have no one available to prepare meals for them.

More than just nutrition, caring drivers provide much needed personal contact, friendship, daily safety checks and peace of mind to homebound seniors in Grand Traverse, Leelanau, Manistee, Missaukee, and Wexford Counties.

"It really is so much more than just a meal, there are many times where our volunteer drivers are the only person our seniors may see for days or weeks," added Robitshek, "we make sure they're alright and remind them someone truly does care about them."

Last year, NMCAA's Meals on Wheels provided approximately 160,000 well-balanced meals, delivering critical nutrition, compassion, security and independence to homebound seniors.
